4. Interest approach - Mental set

Ask students to describe what the exterior of their houses looks like. Ask them what they like about the exterior appearance of homes and what they do not like. Ask them what makes one home look different from another. Show students a slide presentation of different homes and have them make note of the different characteristics that they notice. Try to find a variety of homes such as underground and domed shaped.

Lesson 1 Housing Styles Characteristics

Present Housing Styles power point.

Ask students to identify the style of homes they live in based on three characteristics of the home. What makes their houses appealing or not appealing? Display several pictures of housing around the room. Give students a list of different housing styles and have them use a textbook or the internet to make a list of characteristics of that style.



Lesson 3 Housing Styles Brochure

Given the knowledge of different housing styles, have students create brochures highlighting their three favorite housing styles. Ask them to include descriptions of the homes along with visuals. Have the students create the brochures using Publisher and gather their images from the internet.

Lesson 4 Housing Styles Collage

Place students in teacher-assigned groups. Give each group a list of housing styles to research. Give students access to the internet and housing magazines. Have students work in their group to create a collage of illustrations and characteristics of the given styles. After completion, have each group present its collage to the class.

Notes & Reflections:

Real estate sections in magazines are an excellent place to find photos of homes. Home magazines also feature home exteriors. Brick and siding companies have calendars that promote their products on homes. Ask students if they have family or friends who have availability to resources of housing photos.
