LEARNING EXPERIENCES

Sequence of Instruction

- 1. Identify the Standards. Standards should be posted in the classroom for each lesson.

- **3.** Identify and review the unit vocabulary.

- **5.** Go to the computer lab or bring in airport computer cart. Distribute Step 1 webquest questions. Students work individually or in pairs to complete the questions. Discuss as a class.
- **6.** Distribute information sheets or the FCCLA manuals. Discuss facts that were not included in previous web quest.
- **7.** Students view old FCCLA scrapbooks and photos. Discuss projects listed on information sheets. Discuss STAR events related to course work. Refer to the STAR events manual located on the national website
- **8.** Direct students in an FCCLA scavenger hunt within the classroom.
- **9.** Distribute FCCLA rocks the house brick sheets to groups of students. Students use resources to find answers and participate in review game. Award prizes (optional) to group members that build their FCCLA house first.
