Notes to the Teacher:

Make sure to have Internet access and computers for student use. Students will need a blank CD and possibly CD labels for last project.

Assessment(s) Description/Directions:

Day 1

Introduction: Write the following terms on the board. "House plan, Lesson Plan, Game Plan, Wedding Plan, Vacation Plan." Ask students the significance of making these types of plans. Let students elaborate on what would happen in each scenario if there were no plans. Let this discussion lead to the importance of a business plan for a new entrepreneur. Ask students how they could start a business without a plan.

Give each student the handout "Parts of a Business Plan". Use the presentation "The Formal Business Plan" to demonstrate each section of the business plan. Begin with the importance of the business plan. Make sure to cover the Small Business Administration (<u>www.sba.gov</u>). Go to the website during the presentation and show students what types of resources they have. Tell students to make sure they become very familiar with the

sections of the business plan; they will be quizzed over the material on Day 2. There is a quiz available in the folder titled "Who Am 1?"

Day 2

Start with handing out the quiz titled "Who am I?" You can have students complete individually or in small groups.

Open the spreadsheet "Entrepreneur Resources" and put on the overhead projector. Go to some of the resources on the spreadsheet and point out the numerous amounts of online resources for someone who would like to start their own business. Give students a copy of this spreadsheet. Their assignment is to add more resource websites to this spreadsheet. It is the teacher's discretion as to how many the students will be required to add, depending on class time.

Introduce the Movie Maker Project "How to Create a Business Plan". The students will be creating a movie that explains the sections of the business plan for someone who might be interested in starting their own business, but not sure where to start.

The final requirement for this lesson is to have students to create a CD for entrepreneurs. The CD will include the Movie Maker Project "How to Create a Business Plan", the Excel Spreadsheet "Entrepreneurial Resources", Business Plan Templates found online, and Sample Business Plans found online. You can add to this assignment by having students design the CD cover, whatever time permits.

Day 3-6

Allow students time to work on project. Time may need to be adjusted according to availability of computers and other needed materials

Day 7

Students will present their Movie Maker project to the class and if CD cover was assigned, allow students to pass around their CD for other students to look at.
