
WHERE DO YOUR FOOD DOLLARS GO?

DETERMINE WHO GETS PAID WITH YOUR FOOD DOLLARS!

There are four main areas or job categories of agriculture. Each area eventually receives a share of the money you spent. The share allotted to each area can vary because some products require lots of processing while others are sold just like they come from the field. The figures below are averages:



- ✓ 20% goes to production costs (harvest labor, fertilizer, equipment, etc.)
- ✓ 35% goes to processing (canning, freezing, packaging, etc.)
- ✓ 15% goes to transportation (moving products after they leave the farm)
- ✓ 30% goes to marketing (advertising, selling costs, preparation costs, etc.)

The four boxes below show the four main areas of agriculture. Label each box with the area it represents. Using the percents above, calculate how much of what you spent at the store goes to each area.
