#### **Students with Disabilities:**

For students with disabilities, the instructor should refer to the student's IEP to be sure that the accommodations specified are being provided appropriately. Instructors should also familiarize themselves with the provisions of Behavior Intervention Plans that may be part of a student's IEP. Frequent consultation with a student's special education instructor will be beneficial in providing appropriate differentiation. Many students (both with and without disabilities) who struggle with reading may benefit from the use of text reading software or other technological aids to provide access to printed materials. Many of these are available at little or no cost on the internet.

#### LESSON 1 | LOOKING AT YOURSELF

#### Day 1 – 3: Looking at Yourself

\* Use <u>Looking at Yourself PowerPoint</u> to help teach this lesson. All activities are included in PowerPoint.

#### **Introduction**

- Write the word PERSONALITY on the board and ask students to brainstorm with words that describe people's personalities. Ask them questions like how do we become who we are? What do our personalities say about us? Lead into *Looking at Yourself* (use Looking at Yourself PowerPoint).
- Have students fill out <u>Looking at Yourself Study Guide</u> while working through the <u>Looking at Yourself</u> <u>PowerPoint</u>.
